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The Go Ghaap! Crafts Collection

Many crafters in the Ghaap region make fine products, but they do not reach their markets – whether wholesalers, retailers or consumers. *We hope that our project will address this systemic market failure between Clients and Crafters.*

The **Go Ghaap! Crafts Catalogue** will be distributed to hotels, guest houses, restaurants and coffee shops. We will encourage those businesses to order crafts from the catalogue, either:

- For their own use, e.g. to decorate their facilities, or
- To sell to tourists.

We encourage **tourism establishments** to purchase these crafts, so that **crafters** receive their prices upfront. However, sales "on consignment" could be arranged between tourism establishments and crafters.

Tourism establishments can place their own mark-up on the producer price, according to the nature of their tourism clientele. (Some tourists are willing to pay more than others for products).

Tourism establishments: Please contact the project (Doreen or Lindile) to let us know whether they are participating in the project. Also, we would like to know your experiences with the project, so that we can adjust the project in future.

Crafters: Please let us know if this system works for you!

Please invite other crafters to join the project! The more crafters, the better!

We hope that Crafts Shops in the region may also support these crafters. Once the system has been piloted, we can distribute the *Go Ghaap! Crafts Catalogue* outside the region, to grow our crafts markets even further!

The Go Ghaap! Tourism Route

The Route includes the following towns:

- In Ga-Segonyana LM: Kuruman and Mothibistad
- In Gamagara LM: Kathu, Deben and Olifantshoek
- In Tsantsabane LM: Postmasburg and Jenn-haven
- In Kgatelopele LM: Danielskuil and Lime Acres
- In Siyancuma LM: Griquatown and Campbell.


There are also important "gateway" sites, for travellers moving towards this region: Douglas, Prieska, Barkly West (including Wildebeestkuil), Groblershoop, Niekerkshoop, Vanzylsrus and Kimberley.



Heritage in the Ghaap area

The richness of heritage resources in the Ghaap area is astonishing. This includes:

- Early geological history (from 3 billion years ago)
- of the mining richness of the area, as well as the caves and "eyes" (fountains)
- Early mankind the stone age artefacts at Kathu
- Khoisan history
- Tswana (Thlaping and Rolong) history, at least since 1700
- Griqua history since 1800
- Explorers, travellers, missionaries and the Moffat Mission in Kuruman was the main stop on the "highway to the north", to areas in today's Botswana, Zambia and Malawi
- The brigands, outlaws and renegades of the 1800s
- The wars in the Langberg 1870s and 1890s
- The Anglo-Boer War, and the 1914 rebellion, and
- Recent pro-democracy "struggle history" of the 1980s and 1990s.




CRAFT SHOPS

MOTHIBISTAD: The Workshop Ko-Kasi

The Workshop ko Kasi is an eco-tourism creative hub in Mothibistad, Kuruman. This vibrant space was started by a young lady Mpho Cornelius, who now works with creative entrepreneurs to handle the locals and tourists who walk through their doors. One of their focus areas is to create a platform to showcase the talent of makers and crafters to market their products and this is done through an initiative called Baagisani Pop Up Market which is an event they host once a month. The creative hub has buildings made of recycled materials such as tyres, wood and old scrap – and this creates a stimulating environment for crafters to work there and also showcase. The Workshop ko Kasi also offers meals – including wholewheat pizza with novel toppings and traditional cuisine - a laundry, spa, tented accommodation and a versatile space for meetings and acts as a live performances venue.




Vanzylsrus Hotel Craft Shop

KURUMAN: Boemo Gaobusiwe




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KURUMAN: Mandla Melamu




KATHU: Wannop Dehwe's Zonke Stone Art

Wannop Dehwe is originally from Zimbabwe, but is currently based in Kathu. He holds a degree in Arts and Design, and spent many years teaching at an Art School in Mafikeng before starting his own business. He is an extremely talented artist, producing stone sculptures, abstract art and company logos.

Wannop Dehwe's stone art project has been supported by Khumani Mine's Social Economic Development department and Gamagara Municipality's Local Economic Development Department. Khumani Mine invested in Wannop's vision to transfer his skills of making decorative sculptures out of stone by training five students in the art of stone sculpting as a pilot project.





DOUGLAS: Charles Maruma





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KURUMAN: Hasan Ali's Couture






Zebra crafts on the N12 highway going through Kuruman between Vryburg and Kathu


Daddy works from home, making exquisite and evocative sculptures. He also designs logos and signboards for different markets and clients.








KURUMAN: Willy Machogo's Dikgong Art Décor

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


